With all of the reports of antisemitic incidents in the news, we want you to know that we take security very seriously. TBS now has a security guard at every TBS service and event. When you come to services or an event, take a minute to introduce yourself to our security guard, Corey James.

While having a security guard is a great start, there is much more to do. We are in the processor applying for a Federal Security Grant for houses of worship from Homeland Security. If approved this grant will cover things such was better lighting in the parking lot, cameras, new more secure doors and windows, bollards around the building, training for members in case of attack and much more. I had the sheriff's office do an assessment and a list of security needs to be submitted with the grant application. Along with that we got quotes for new windows and doors and are looking for fencing and other items suggested by the sheriff. Everything we do, we will try to make as attractive as possible so that we do not look like a fortress. Everybody's input will be appreciated.

The grant can be up to \$150,000 and can only be used for security. We should hear some time in September or October we will be awarded the grant. In the meantime, Peter and I are arranging for safety workshops to help keep us all safe. We will let you know when those are scheduled so that you may attend.

Eventually, at a friend's suggestion, I started taking classes near my home in MA and realized that I wanted to teach!

Type to enter text What does Yoga and its philosophy give me that I didn't have before? **ACCEPTANCE**!

In the Yoga Practice, It's **OK** to do Tree Pose holding onto a wall, because you're still **doing** it... only with **Support**! It's **OK** to hold Warrior II for several breaths one time and the next time come out after only 2 or 3 breaths, because perhaps your leg hurts or you're tired that day.

So now I maintain my Jewish identity and have Yoga to Balance out my life and accept myself with my imperfections!

Yesterday, we and a few members of the Portuguese club made the Passover Seder meal for Temple Beth Shalom in CC. It was exhausting and exhilarating. We made for 60 members, matzo ball soup, tsimmis, salad, chopped liver, gefilte fish, baked chicken and potato kugel.

Making the chopped liver was mostly my job and as incredibly messy as it came out!! Making potato kugel was another exhausting task, shredding 80 pounds of potatoes I was like OMG, but with Fernanda's and Maria's help we got through it.

WE ALL GOT ONE HECK OF AN EDUCATION! Felt my parents with us so strongly. We used the kitchen utensils that were my parents. I have not been to a Seder since back in NJ like 1987, and it brought back so many memories. The Seder was fantastic, the cantor is from Philly. Everyone there was so happy, so warm, so inviting and so appreciative of our hard work.

Our crew started Thursday, Melly and I shopped early in the morning and met the crew at 1pm for the next day, back at 10am more prepping, cooking, then finishing it up, serving homestyle, then cleaning up. By the end of the evening Melly and I felt like "we were home" and had made so many new friends we look to as extended family. I have not been around that many Jewish people since my days of BBYO. As I write this my eyes my eyes tear up with happiness. I missed being around "my people" and it really soothed my heart. Missing my parents, my sister and nieces and family that is now scattered everywhere more than ever. As I sit at the Seder, being flooded by the memories of the HUGE family meals, filling our home with our grandparents, aunt's, great uncles, cousin.

Ma was the glue that brought the family together. Doo maintained the traditions and stood by her side helping with anything she needed. I knew this was the best thing we have done for our emotional well being. I know I am sounding like a mush, but its all how I feel. We cannot ever fully express our thanks to the best and most loyal friends from the Portuguese American club of Southwest Fl. who volunteered and supported us Maria Silveira- the best salad maker ever plus she does anything to help, Frenderico Pinto and his wife Fernanda "Maria", F who are also special angels like Maria do anything we needed, cutting, chopping, cleaning and took on the monumental task of washing and drying countless dishes never ever complaining, Fernanda Coelho and her husband, Justino stood by our side doing whatever was needed, both in the kitchen and helping with the set up of the tables and chairs, etc. Fernanda stepped in to help with physical lifting that neither Melly and I could fo because of our bad backs. Joe da Mota set the room up hauling the tables and chairs, helped clean up after the Seder then helped take it all down, put it away, cleaned the floor, and set the chairs back up, put our pots and pans and whatever supplies we had away. Janice Albion, from the Temple, made the delicious matzo balls for the soup and helped us in the kitchen, guided us as to which foods go out and when. She helped me serve the entrees to the tables, helped clean up and more. Another new friend for us! Helene Glocer from the Temple who was coordinating the Seder setup and helped in any way she could. Robin and Jerry Razowsky. Robin made the best coconut macaroons, that are out of this world, Jerry helped Joe setting the chairs back up in the hall and more. Both so nice, friendly, she is funny and he was so interesting to talk with we are grateful for their friendship.

So many others I am just learning their names!

Melly, the most precious gift in my life, coordinates the whole process. I personally will never understand how she manages to create all the meals to have everything timed right and turn out so delicious, but she is the Chef DE Cuisine and this is her profession. It is what she loves to do!! She and I have studied with the help of recipes from Denise Simenaur, watched videos (gotta love You Tube). We created a book of recipes for future reference. Even though Melly has not been physically well, you would never know it, by the smile on her face. She has incredible patience, (especially with me as I lack experience in the kitchen). She never complains as she tediously guided us all for each item created. She is a blessing in my life. Meeting Peter and Denise Simenauer this past NYE, was I believe gift from my parents. They are the kindest, sweetest people and offering the club to hold our feasts at the Temple truly changed our lives. Denise is so sweet, so warmed we just instantly bonded. Peter reminds me so much of my dad in so many ways The many people we met not only took the time to express their appreciation us, they helped with the clean up process. 




