Is nothing sacred? Are we allowed to change or apply even our most hallowed traditions with impunity?

A number of years ago during an intense political campaign the conservative candidate accused his opponent of being a liberal. As if that were not enough, he went on to define a liberal as one who regards the 10 Commandments as 10 suggestions.

Are our religious events and artifacts too fragile to survive an updating journey? Our sages urge the rabbis to persuade all to be there to witness and share the special Sinai experience. Then too, there is the special reinforcing urgency of the timing. The exodus of the past was fading, the present was dizzying at the base of the mountain, and the future was put in jeopardy by the idolatry of the golden calf.

No easy time but it all worked out. Why? Because the 10 Commandments accomplished many miracles; they restored our holy connections to the past, the present and above all to a Jewish future. They gave us back our sanity, self-worth, pride, and purpose at a time when all was shaky. And finally, they reminded us that without an aspirational vision of moral behavior the people perish.

My argument then is that the Torah is not locked in time nor stuck in context. It is a compilation of stories, rituals, architecture, forms, format etc., too rich, too available, and too wise to leave untapped. Indeed, when the history of its biblical timing seems to coincide and even reinforce current similar contemporary events and chronology, updating, modernizing and application are not only justified even welcoming. It may also help us survive our fragmented times.

Send Along Some Sunshine


A happy occasion like a birthday or anniversary is a perfect reason to "Send Along Some Sunshine".


