
Of course, I've thought of a couple of things I'd like to say. Nothing coming together as an article, just some random thoughts.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

At Temple Beth Shalom in Cape Coral our children are the future of Judaism. We therefore include religious school as part of temple membership—that is, there is no additional charge for a congregant's child(ren) to attend religious school.

Aliza Bental, our excellent Hebrew teacher, continues to focus on Hebrew with holidays, prayers, history, etc. branching off the Hebrew content. We begin each session with the students doing the blessings over wine (grape juice) and challah followed by a small snack.

Following are some highlights from this busy school year. The last session of class will be held on May 12.

A back-to-school bowling and pizza party was held for students and their families on August 30 prior to the start of religious school on September 3. It was a fun way to end the summer and get the new and “old” students, as well as their families, acquainted.

During the High Holidays, youth services were held for both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. The services were led by four post-B'nai Mitzvah young people. They did an outstanding job! A special thank you to Marty Burnette for blowing the Shofar during those services. Both services were very well attended!

On October 1 in addition to class time, the students decorated the Sukkah. Parents and siblings helped too. All present had pizza. As was apparent to everyone who attended the Sukkot and Shabbat dinner and service on October 2, the Sukkah was beautiful.

During school on January 21, the students participated in a TuB'shvat Seder led by Rabbi Buchen. The students and some family members sampled fruits with an inedible shell, fruits with an inedible pit or seed, and fruits that were edible inside and out.

The students had a special project on March 17 where they painted ceramic Kiddish cups to use at the model Passover Seder held on April 21 during school. Rabbi Buchen led the Passover Seder.

May 5 the students participated in a beautiful Yom HaShoah candle lighting memorial program.

During the last session of school on May 12, the students will have a Yom HaAtzma'ut, Israeli Independence Day, commemoration as well as an end-of-school party.

But, here it is; updated, even though nothing has changed.

Building and Grounds would like to continue to gather quotes and information and some actions for the following projects:

1. It would be nice to replace the parking lot, leveling it out so that water runs somewhere else.
 2. Barring that, it might be possible to dig up the grass between parking spaces and fill it in with drainage rocks.
 3. Barring that, we might be able to dig a trench through the low part of the parking lot and run it to the southernmost retention pond beyond the Holocaust memorial.
 4. It is hoped that the ground cover plants Fern Deutch donated will fill in and beautify the front of the Temple. If not, maybe more can be had.
 5. It is still necessary that the two Palms in the planter at the entrance to the Temple be removed to be able to read the sign on our building.
 6. And then, the sign needs to be re-painted, along with the dark squares that don't match the faded paint-above the sign.
 7. The back yard is an ongoing project to replace some very trashy trees with hedge plants and palms.
 8. The parking lot will look much nicer whenever it can be edged. If I can't get to it before Rosh Hashana, I'll get the grass cutters to do that.
 9. Inside, I would like to finish changing out the old fluorescent lights for the hi-intensity ones.
 10. It would be nice to paint the back hallway with colors similar to the social hall.
 11. One congregant, WHO IS WILLING TO HELP, changing out the sagging ceiling tiles for new ones. We have some spares.




